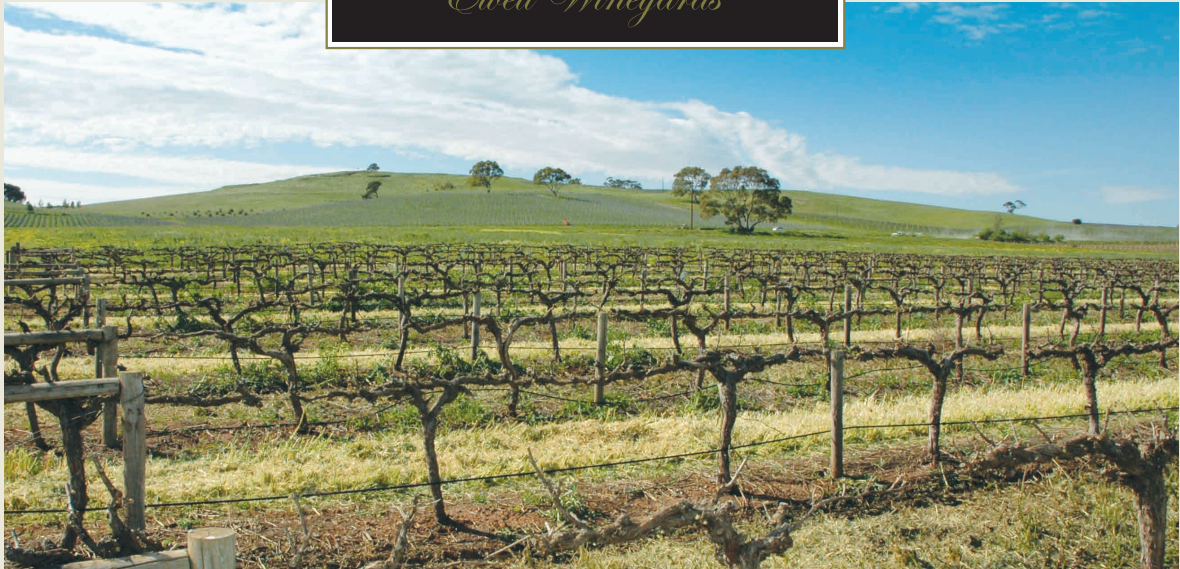

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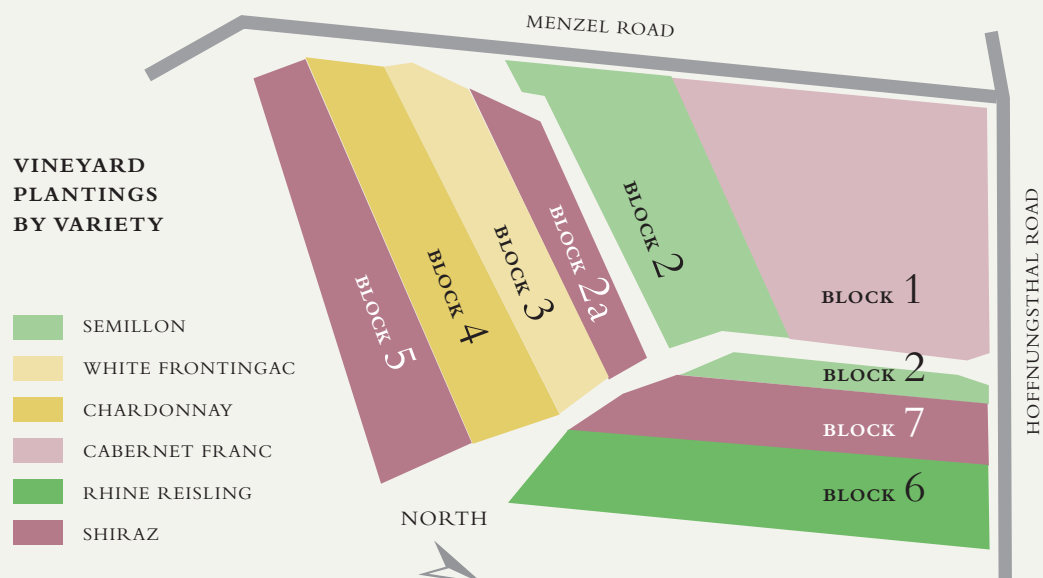

## TWEEDIES GULLY *Vineyard*

Located in the foothills between Lyndoch and Williamstown the Tweedies Gully Vineyard is a climatic mix of the Barossa Valley and Adelaide Hills. With higher rainfall and cooler temperatures than the neighbouring Barossa Valley floor the white varieties retain better balance while the reds maximise flavour maturity thanks to a longer ripening period. The vineyard has soils that are superb for winegrape production making this vineyard truly noteworthy.





### TWEEDIES GULLY *Vineyard*

#### **BLOCK 1 *Cabernet Franc* (3.72Ha)**

Year planted: About 1990

Vineyard typography: North facing hill. Moderate slope.

Soil: Brown loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: East-West rows. Two-wire vertical trellis system.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regulated deficit irrigation.

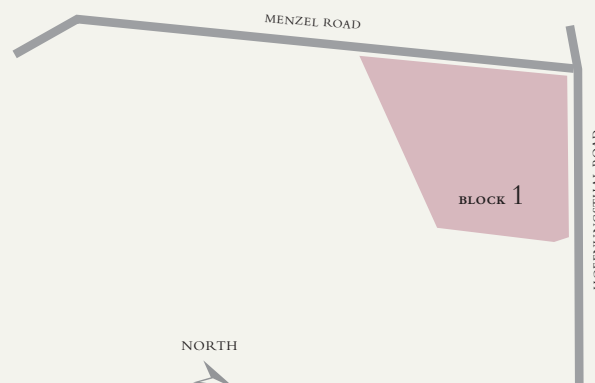
Indicative yield: 35 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th March



***Winemakers notes:*** Cabernet Franc, a variety on the way back in.

This block is a great example of why this is so. The red clay soil provides an excellent medium to deliver moisture at a restricted rate. This allows the growth of moderate, well balanced canopies and bunches with an open architecture and small berries. This combined with the sites cooler nature allows excellent flavour and tannin development.





## TWEEDIES GULLY *Vineyard*

### BLOCK 2 *Semillon (2.4Ha)*

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard typography: North-East facing hill. Moderate slope.

Soil: Brown loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: North-South rows. Spur pruned. Two-wire vertical trellis system.

Irrigation: Drip Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned.

Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 19 tonne

Expected harvest date: 20th February



**Winemakers notes:** Climatically we believe this is an excellent area for Semillon with cooler temperatures than the valley floor helping to retain acidity and with the ability to ripen early avoiding any disease issues. The Easterly aspect further helps to moderate temperatures.





### **TWEEDIES GULLY *Vineyard***

#### **BLOCK 2a *Shiraz (1.Ha)***

Year planted: 2009

Clone/Rootstock: R6WV28/Ruggeri 140

Vineyard topography: West facing gentle slope.

Vineyard Soil: Centre ridge of heavy red clay (3/4) flanked by Alluvial sands (1/4)

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon.

Irrigation: Drip. (Dripper output matched to soil type)

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regulated deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 10 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th March



***Winemakers notes:*** Newly planted in 2009 this block is set to produce stunning fruit. The block combines the excellent R6WV28 Shiraz clone with a climate and soil combination conducive to growing very high quality shiraz. This combination should prove to be a success similar to that of block 7. In addition the new drip irrigation system has a differentiated rate output to match the soil types.





### TWEEDIES GULLY *Vineyard*

#### BLOCK 3 *White Frontignac (1.11Ha)*

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard topography: Block straddles a West facing hill of a moderate slope.

Vineyard Soil: Heavy red clay ridge through the middle of the block.

Alluvial sandy loam on lower sections.

Site layout and trellising: North-South rows. Spurred single cordon.

Foliage catch wire.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Tight hand pruning. Soil moisture monitoring. Shoot thinning.

Indicative yield: 11 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th February



**Winemakers notes:** White Frontignac is another variety on the comeback trail. With its intoxicating and distinct flavour profile it's a winner in the marketplace. This block has been re-trellised with the vines chain sawed back to life in winter 2008. The resulting vines have been reinvigorated and are producing beautiful fruit. The block is pruned and shoot thinned to avoid any overcropping or clumping of fruit.





### TWEEDIES GULLY *Vineyard*

#### BLOCK 4 *Chardonnay (2.23Ha)*

Year planted: 1996

Vineyard topography: Block straddles a Western facing ridge with both North and South facing slopes.

Vineyard Soil: Sandy Brown Loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: North-South rows. Close planted at 2.7m x 1.0m spacing. Unilaterally trained. Spurred single cordon. Foliage catch wire.

Irrigation: Drip

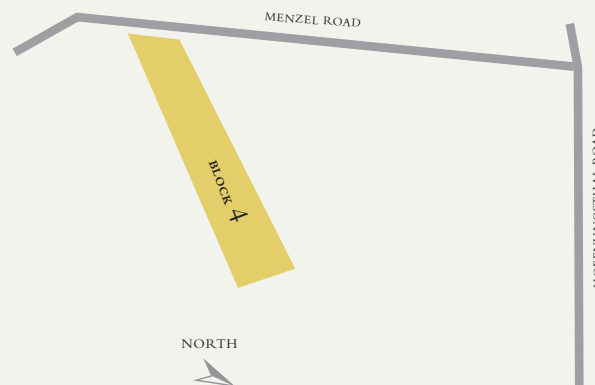
Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 18 tonne

Expected harvest date: 10th February



**Winemakers notes:** Due to the overall location of the vineyard and generally cooler temperatures this Chardonnay sits in the middle of Adelaide Hills and Barossa Valley styles. Picked right it's vibrant, tight and retains acidity yet has a richer palate than a true cool climate Chardonnay.





## TWEEDIES GULLY *Vineyard*

### BLOCK 5 *Shiraz (1.16Ha)*

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard topography: Gentle South West facing slope.

Vineyard Soil: Sandy loam over deep sandy clay. Eastern third of the block has soils consisting of heavy red clays.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon. Twin foliage catch wires.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regulated deficit irrigation.

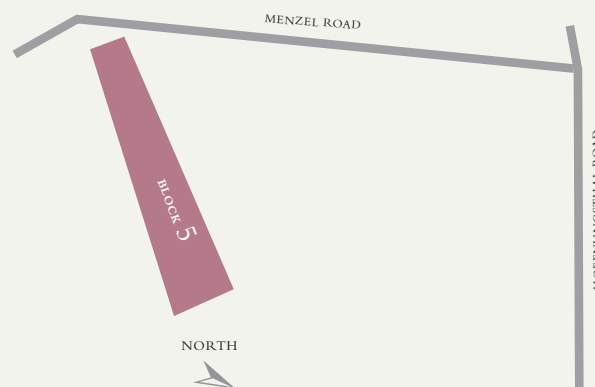
Indicative yield: 11 tonne

Expected harvest date: 20th March



**Winemakers notes:** Old vine Shiraz hand pruned for balanced croploads.

A permanent midrow sward has been planted to regulate soil moisture and increase soil organic carbon levels. The winegrapes of the lower section have flavours in the blue fruit spectrum along with pepper and spice. The Eastern end shows more rich black fruits due to the heavy clay soils. The block is irrigated in two sections to maximise quality potential using regulated deficit irrigation techniques.





### TWEEDIES GULLY *Vineyard*

#### **BLOCK 6 *Riesling (2.33Ha)***

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard topography: Gentle South-West facing slope.

Vineyard Soil: Sandy loam over clay. Centre third, heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon.

Irrigation: Drip

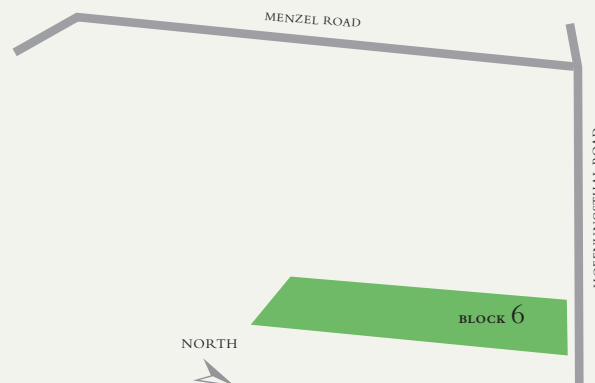
Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 20 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th February



***Winemakers notes:*** Old vine Riesling that is more reminiscent of Eden Valley than Barossa Valley due to the vineyards foothill location. The noticeably cooler temperatures help retain fruit acidity and freshness. Row orientation is East-West providing protection for the fruit from the summer sun.





## TWEEDIES GULLY *Vineyard*

### **BLOCK 7 Shiraz (1.78Ha)**

Year planted: 1996

Vineyard typography: Block straddles a Western facing ridge with both North and South facing slopes.

Vineyard Soil: Shattered parent rock intermixed with heavy red clays.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon. Foliage catch wire.

Irrigation: Drip

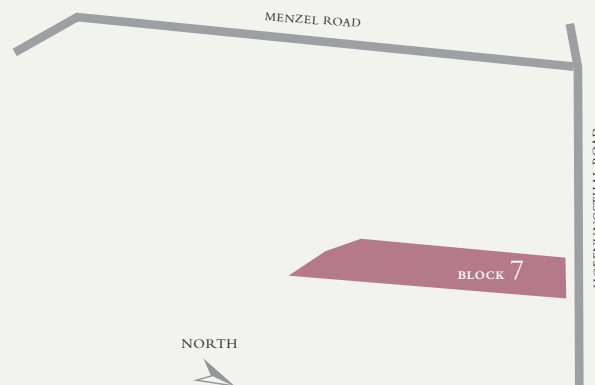
Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regulated deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 14 tonne

Expected harvest date: 5th March



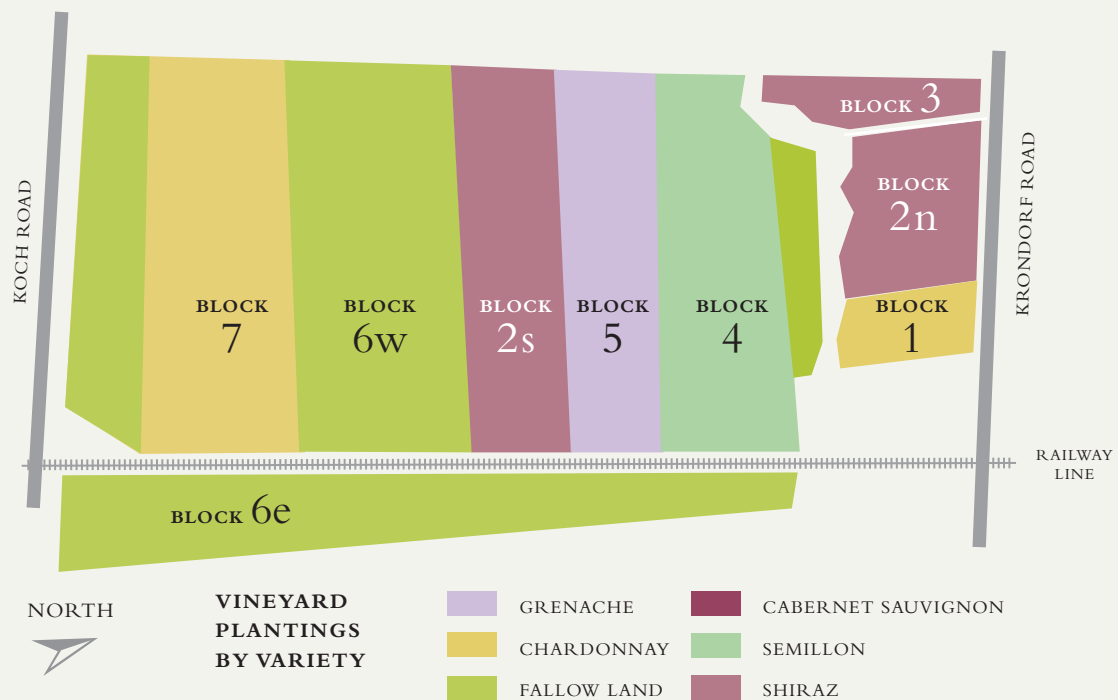
***Winemakers notes:*** This steep, exposed site has soils that are largely restrictive to vine growth. The resultant battle for survival produces winegrapes with fruit power, complexity and excellent tannin structure. The vines are settling into their prime production period. Has achieved “A” grade in Fosters (Penfolds) grading system. Most recently “B” contracted Foster’s block





## RAILWAY *Vineyard*

The Railway Vineyard is situated on Krondorf Rd, Tanunda. This area has long had a reputation for high quality winegrape production largely due to the mix of excellent viticultural soils and the localised gully breezes that stem from the nearby hills. The Railway Vineyard soils have been well matched to the planted varieties ensuring consistent high-quality winegrape production.





## **RAILWAY** *Vineyard*

### **BLOCK 1** *Chardonnay (.71Ha)*

Year planted: Approximately 1975

Vineyard topography: Flat. Slight South Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Alluvial gravel and sandy loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon. North-South row orientation.

Irrigation: Drip

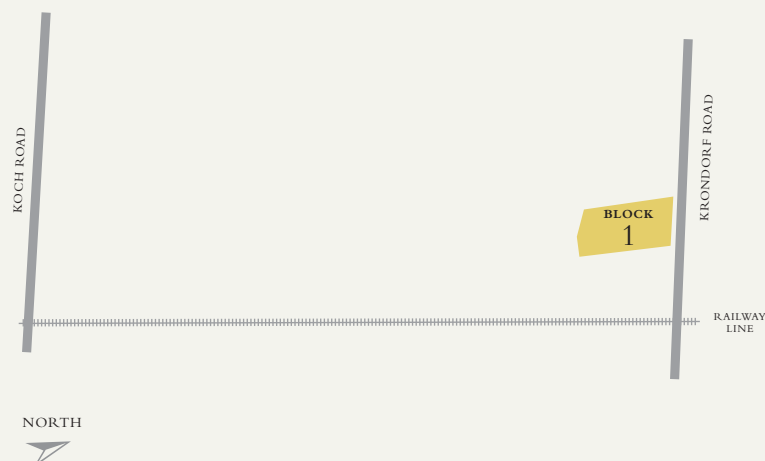
Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 3 tonne

Expected harvest date: 12 February



***Winemakers notes:*** This small block of Chardonnay is typically picked with Block 7 Chardonnay. It consists of old vines that generate modest tonnages. As a result fruit flavours develop quickly allowing early picking at 12-12.5 Baume and retaining excellent levels of acidity.





## **RAILWAY** *Vineyard*

### **BLOCK 2 Shiraz North (1.8Ha)**

Year planted: -1950s

Vineyard topography: Slight South Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Alluvial gravel and sandy loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon. Twin foliage catch wires. North-South row orientation.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring.

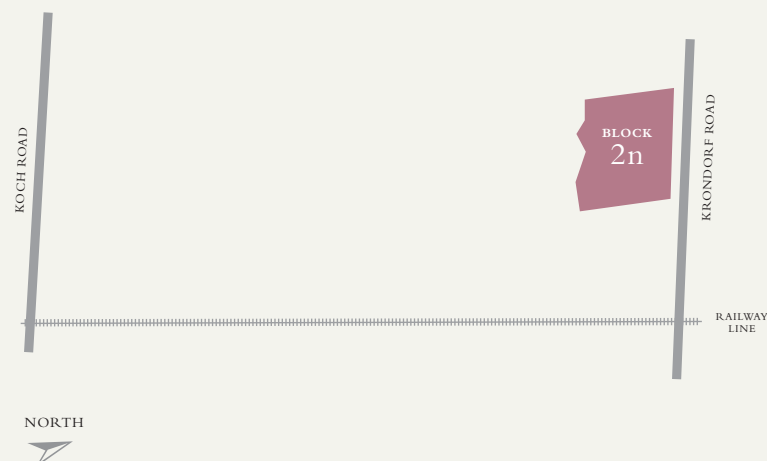
New trellis and irrigation installed. Regulated deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 12 tonne

Expected harvest date: 12 March



**Winemakers notes:** Reworked in 2008 with extensive chainsawing of dead and Eutypa infected wood. This was followed with the installation of new trellising and irrigation. The block is hand pruned to ensure the vines are in balance and is irrigation using regulated deficit irrigation techniques helping to maximise fruit quality. A stunning block of Barossa old vine Shiraz of approximately 60 years of age. Most recently a Foster's "B" graded block, however this contract was written before re-working.





### **RAILWAY Vineyard**

#### **BLOCK 2 Shiraz - South (4.37Ha)**

Year planted: Approximately 1975

Vineyard topography: Flat. Slight Westerly aspect

Vineyard Soil: Sandy loam over clay. Bay of Biscay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon.

East-West row orientation.

Irrigation: Drip

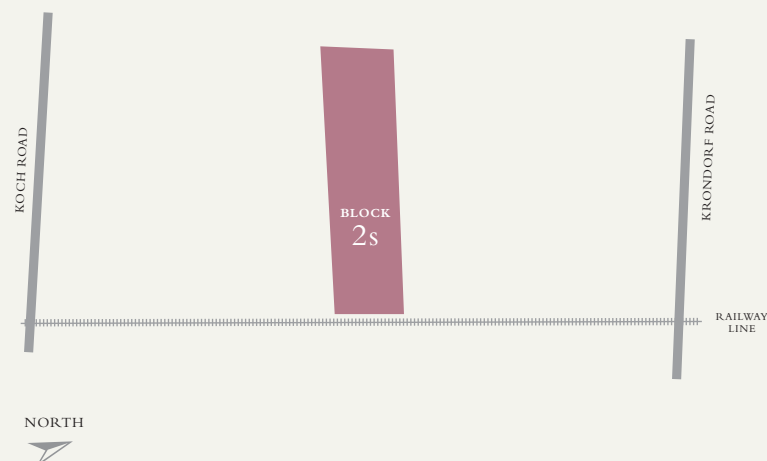
Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 20 tonne

Expected harvest date: 12 March



**Winemakers notes:** A block which has had it tough in years gone by but under the weary exterior are true old Shiraz vines. To ensure the best out of this block we hand prune each vine according to its capacity. The result is a mix of flavour nuances from each vine that when combined create a wine of complexity and intrigue. Most recently a Foster's "B" graded block.





## **RAILWAY** *Vineyard*

### **BLOCK 3 Shiraz (0.71Ha)**

Year planted: 1970's.

Clone: Grafted in 1994 onto Crouchen.

Vineyard topography: Slight South Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Alluvial gravel and sandy loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon.

Irrigation: Drip

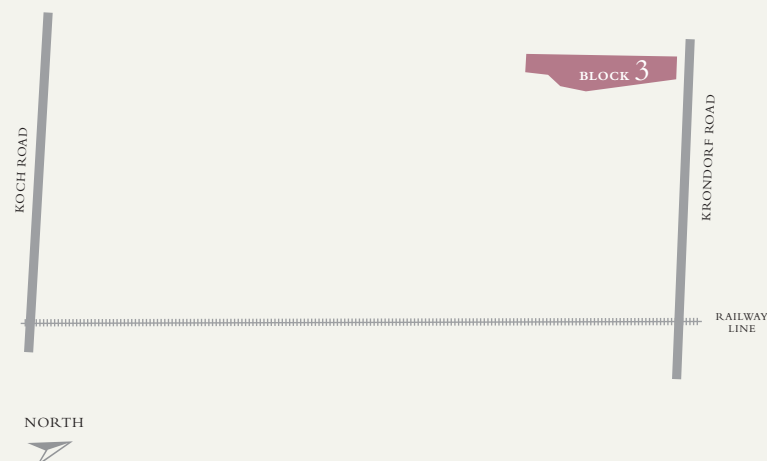
Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regulated deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 5 tonne

Expected harvest date: 12 March



**Winemakers notes:** Old vine root structure combined with a subsoil of deep red clay gives this grafted Shiraz block classic Barossa Shiraz intensity. Moderate vigour, balanced pruning and regular deficit irrigation all help to strengthen fruit quality. Has achieved Foster's "A" grading. Most recently a Foster's "B" graded block.





## **RAILWAY** *Vineyard*

### **BLOCK 4** *Semillon (5.08Ha)*

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard typography: Slight Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Combination of Sandy loam over red clay and patches of black cracking clay (Biscay).

Site layout and trellising: Spurred vertical double cordon. Some spurred single cordon rows.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 40 tonne

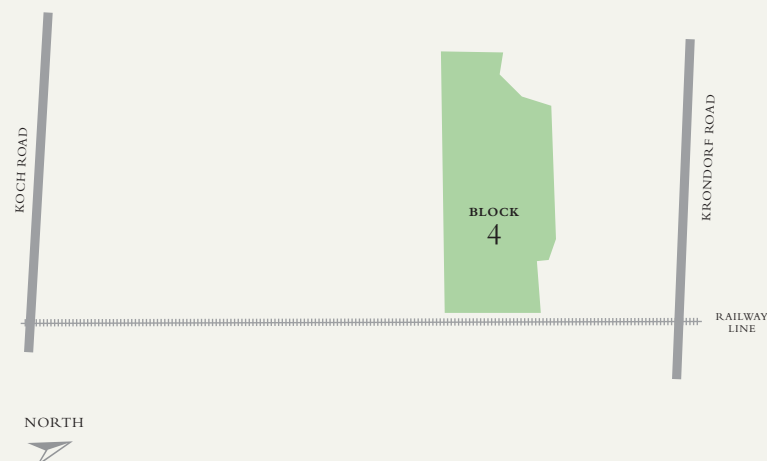
Expected harvest date: 17th February



**Winemakers notes:** Old vine Semillon with an East-West row orientation.

This helps provide shade from the summer sun preserving fruit freshness.

In addition the low lying typography combined with the gully winds results in cool air giving relief during the nights helping to retain acidity and flavour





## **RAILWAY** *Vineyard*

### **BLOCK 5** *Grenache (3.27Ha)*

Year planted: Approximately 1975

Small percentage of Cabernet Sauvignon and Mataro vines.

Vineyard topography: South-Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Sandy loam over red clays.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon with long spur positions.

Irrigation: Drip

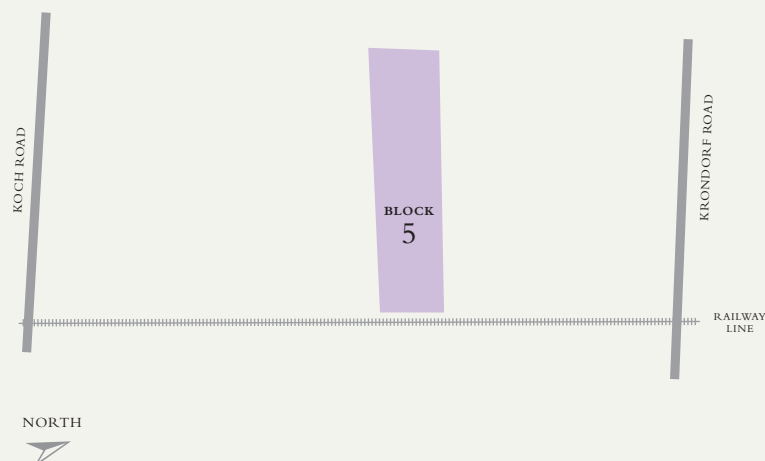
Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regular deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 20 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th March



**Winemakers notes:** This old vine Grenache block has an exciting smattering of Cabernet Sauvignon and Mataro vines throughout. The resulting wine is highly fragrant with red berry fruits, pepper and spice dominating. The clay based soils provide a generous yet restrictive water source resulting in balanced vines and flavour packed fruit. Most recently a Foster's "B" graded block.





## **RAILWAY** *Vineyard*

### **BLOCK 7** *Chardonnay (6.80Ha)*

Year planted: Approximately 1985

Vineyard topography: Flat. Slight South Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Majority black cracking clay (Biscay).

Eastern quarter sandy loam over red clays.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon. East-West row orientation.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 50 tonne

Expected harvest date: 12 February.



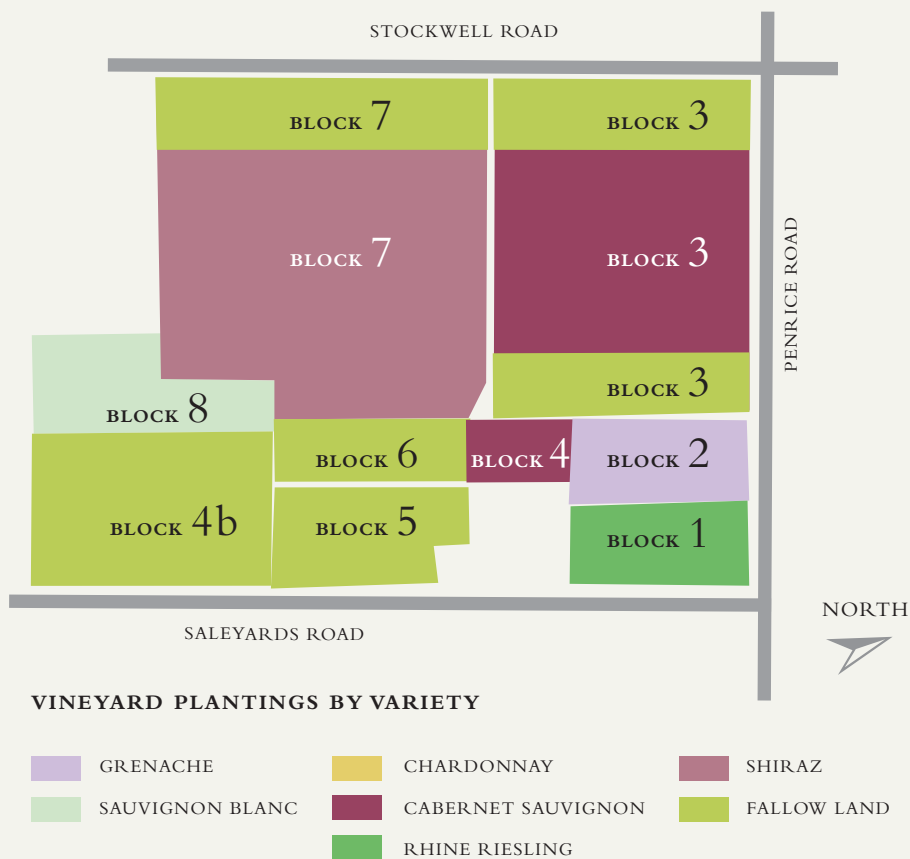
**Winemakers notes:** The heavy black cracking clay provides a level of vigour that generates a decent sized canopy that is not overly vigorous however does provide a level of dappled light to shade from the summer sun. Further in its favour is the East-West row orientation. The 'Krondorf doctor' (the gully breezes off the neighbouring hills) further moderates the site temperatures. The result is a super solid block of old vine Chardonnay. Recommend picking at 12-12.5 Baume.





## FULLER'S *Vineyard*

The Fuller's Vineyard is situated at Penrice in the Barossa Valley. It is viticulture and winemaking gold. With soils of heavy red clay and limestone it is perfect for winegrape production. In addition its elevated location at the foothills of the Barossa Ranges helps to moderate temperatures. This allows for excellent flavour accumulation and retention.





## FULLER'S *Vineyard*

### BLOCK 1 *Riesling (1.2Ha)*

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard topography: Slight Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Sandy Loam over deep limestone.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon with foliage catchwire.

North-South row orientation.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 9 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th February



**Winemakers notes:** Vine age combined with the massive subsoil of pure limestone and cool gully breezes results in a block of Riesling that punches well beyond its Barossa Valley floor status. Pick it early and lean for the best results.





## FULLER'S *Vineyard*

### BLOCK 2 *Grenache (1.61Ha)*

Year planted: 1910s

Vineyard topography: Slight Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Sandy Loam over deep limestone.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon. North South row orientation.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regular deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 5 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th March



***Winemakers notes:*** A piece of living Barossa History. This 90+ year old Grenache block has been spared its life due to its age. The block has been chain sawed in winter 2008 to remove Eutypa infected wood promoting new healthy growth. The vines are individually balanced pruned and shoot thinned to avoid overcropping. The subsoil is a very unique part of this block with the majority of it consisting of a continuous limestone mass permeated by vine roots. The end result of age and soil is ethereal wines of subtle power and intensity. A real winemaker's block





### FULLER'S *Vineyard*

#### **BLOCK 3 *Cabernet Sauvignon* (7.4Ha)**

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard topography: Slight Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Brown sandy loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon. North-South row orientation.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regular deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 25 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th March



***Winemakers notes:*** Old vine Cabernet Sauvignon vines that eek and creak out wines of intense varietal expression. A low yielding clone ensures that there is always plenty of leaf ‘horsepower’ to maximise flavour accumulation. The soil largely consists of clays that provide a restrictive access to a large amount of soil moisture allowing balanced shoot and fruit growth and ensuring maximum flavour accumulation through the ripening period. Most recently a “B” graded Foster’s contracted block.





## FULLER'S *Vineyard*

### BLOCK 6 *Cabernet Sauvignon* (1.31Ha)

Year planted: 1993

Clone: CW44. Grafted onto Chardonnay in 2009

Vineyard topography: Slight Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Brown sandy loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon with catch wire.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regular deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 10 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th March



**Winemakers notes:** Recently grafted in 2009 with an excellent strike rate. This has resulted in a uniform block of vines of the excellent CW44 clone. The soils consist of deep red clays that provide a restrictive access to a large amount of soil moisture. This allows balanced shoot and fruit growth ensuring maximum flavour accumulation through the ripening period.





## FULLER'S *Vineyard*

### BLOCK 7 Shiraz (8.13Ha)

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard topography: Slight Westerly aspect.

Vineyard Soil: Brown sandy loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon.

Irrigation: Drip

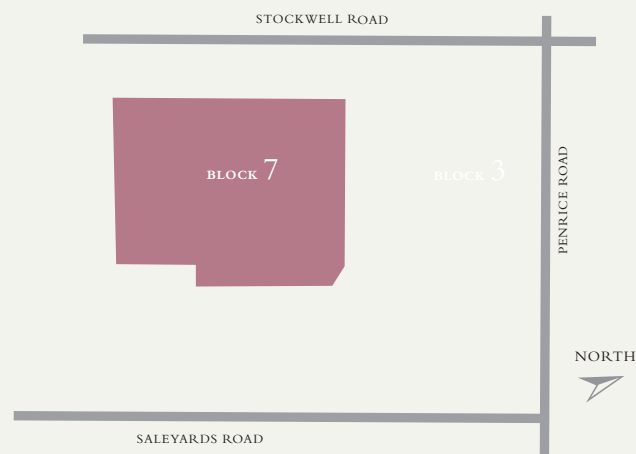
Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regular deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 40 tonne

Expected harvest date: 5th March



**Winemakers notes:** An excellent block of Shiraz that is capable of achieving outstanding levels of quality. Has often made 'A' grade for Foster's and was commonly sent to Penfolds. Most recently a Foster's "B" graded block. A powerful Shiraz that reflects the multiple layers of red clay based soils beneath.





### FULLER'S *Vineyard*

#### **BLOCK 8 *Sauvignon Blanc* (1.8Ha)**

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard topography: Slight Westerly aspect

Vineyard Soil: Brown sandy loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned.

Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 10 tonne

Expected harvest date: 5th February



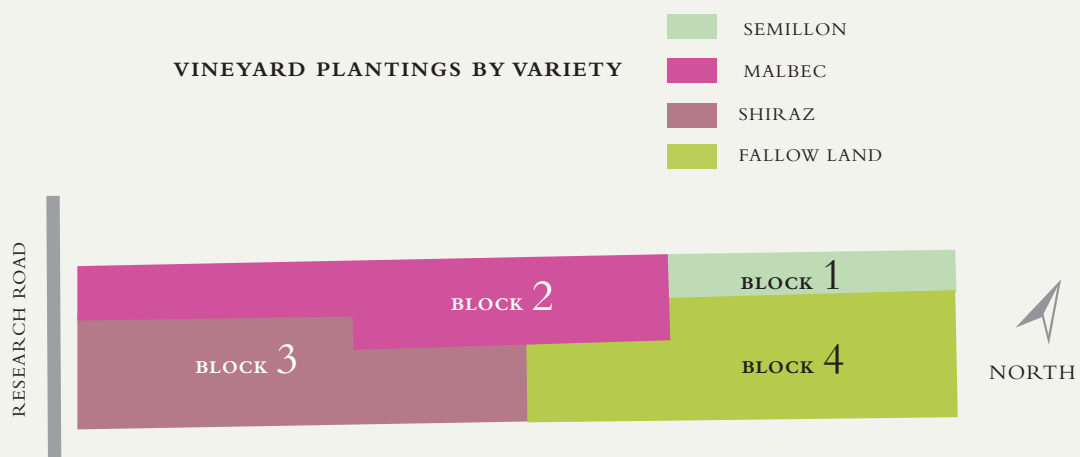
***Winemakers notes:*** Old vine Sauvignon Blanc that ripens early and is through the winery before fermenters are tied up with the bulk of vintage. Handy for any Barossa labelled white wine that needs a classic Sauvignon Blanc aroma lift. Not to mention Sauvignon Blanc is still a saleable wine.





## ROHRLACH'S *Block*

Situated on Research Road, Nuriootpa, the Rohrlach's Block key feature is the deep clay based soils. These soils have an excellent capacity to hold moisture giving the plant an accessible source of water but at restrictive rates. The result is high quality fruit.





## ROHRLACH'S *Block*

### **BLOCK 1 *Semillon (.85Ha)***

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard typography: Flat. East-West row orientation.

Vineyard Soil: Brown sandy loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring.

Indicative yield: 10 tonne

Expected harvest date: 18th February



#### ***Winemakers notes:***

Old vine Semillon that consistently bares  
8-10 tonne of well balanced fruit.

### ROHRLACH'S *Block*

#### **BLOCK 2 *Malbec* (1.47Ha)**

Year planted: 1970s

Vineyard topography: Flat. East-West row orientation.

Vineyard Soil: Brown sandy loam over heavy clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regular deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 15 tonne

Expected harvest date: 20th March



***Winemakers notes:*** A variety that is coming back in vogue. This old vine block produces highly aromatic medium bodied wine with aromas of red berries, white pepper and spice. One of only 2 Malbec blocks that was contracted to Foster's.

### ROHRLACH'S *Block*

#### **BLOCK 3 Shiraz (1.57Ha)**

Year planted: 1970s

Clone: R6WV28 (Tahbilk) grafted onto Chardonnay

Vineyard topography: Flat. East-West row orientation.

Vineyard Soil: Brown sandy loam over heavy red clay.

Site layout and trellising: Spurred single cordon.

Irrigation: Drip

Viticultural management/practices: Hand pruned. Soil moisture monitoring. Regular deficit irrigation.

Indicative yield: 12 tonne

Expected harvest date: 15th March



***Winemakers notes:*** Highly successful grafting has resulted in a block that has even vine growth throughout. The R6WV28 (Tahbilk) clone is delivering excellent results in the winery for its immensely dark colour and deep, rich flavour profile.

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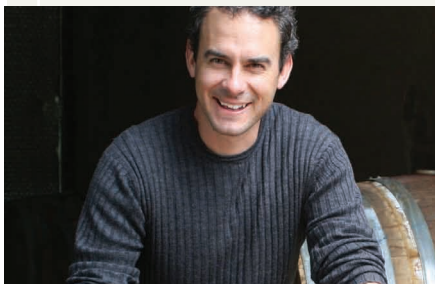
